# The Competition

---

- Each shooting guest will shoot at approximately 80 clays in addition to a 100 clay simulated pheasant flush, where all four guns will shoot together.
- On each of the ten stands, there will be a professional, qualified instructor who will assist less experienced guns if required and ensure that the highest level of safety is adhered to at all times.
- One stand gives guests the chance to shoot with an air rifle rather than a shotgun.
- One stand is set up as the 'small bore challenge'. Guests are given the opportunity to shoot with a smaller bore shotgun to double their score.
- Based on the final scores, prizes will be awarded to Top Gun, Top Lady, Top Team and Clay Conservation team.
- We would recommend that each team provide an appropriate team name.
- The shooting stands are selected in order to fulfil the following criteria:
  - To avoid queuing wherever possible.
  - To take account of less experienced guns.

## Clothing

Please dress with the weather in mind. Stout shoes or boots and a waterproof coat are all that you need to bring.
